



COVID-19 update in Nepal

The Government of Nepal has extended the ongoing lockdown imposed to control the spread of the corona virus for the eighth time till 14 June 2020 (32 Jestha 2077). All domestic and international flights & public transport have been suspended till 30 June 2020. The lockdown was first imposed on 24 March 2020 and has completed 76 days as of 7 June 2020.

The number of people testing positive for corona virus is increasing day by day & has reached 3,235 with 13 deaths till 6 June 2020. In spite of increasing number of cases, public outcry to lift the lockdown has begun to emerge, with daily wage workers facing difficulties and businesses complaining of losses. To address the situation Government of Nepal (GoN) has partly lifted restrictions on vehicular movements by implementing the 'time card' system in Kathmandu valley. As per the system, vehicles belonging to essential services, banking & government employees are allowed to ply the Kathmandu roads during specific time periods.

PKF Nepal Updates

Work from home

Recent Updates

Announcement of budget

On 28 May 2020, the Finance Minister, Dr. Yuba Raj Khatiwada presented Rs 1.474 trillion budget for the fiscal year 2077-78 (2020-21). As the coronavirus pandemic has hard hit the country, the budget has allocated significant resources to the health sector and other major industries that help to rejuvenate the economy. Moreover, the government has set an economic growth target at 7% which is unlikely to be achieved due to the impact in the econnomy due to the pandemic.





Major changes of finance bill

Income Tax

- Tax concession for micro, cottage & small industries has been provided based on their annual turnover.
- Period of tax exemption for micro enterprises, travel & tourism industry, special industry has been increased.
- Income tax is exempted for Drinking Water and Sanitation Consumer Groups operating as per their objectives. Income tax waived on tax assessed up to FY 2075-76
- Rebate on tax rate in case of hotel, travel, trekking, transport and airline industry.
- The contributions made to the Corona Fund shall be deductible for computation of taxable income for the FY 2019-20.
- Income tax exemption granted to coperatives operating in rural municipality whereas, tax rate has been revised in case of cooperatives operating in areas other than rural municipality.
- Waiver in tax applicable on retirement payment if approved retirement fund operated in different institutions is transferred to Social Security Fund.
- Requirement of PAN for daily wages and expenses has been revised.
- Amnesty has been provided to nonregisterd and nonfiler for registration in tax.

Value Added Tax

- Exemption of VAT imposed on micro enterprise insurance.
- Submission of VAT returns and payment on a trimester basis allowed to tourism, transportation and movie theatres.
- VAT exempted on import of raw material by pharmaceutical industries and VAT refund to be provided if the raw materials are procured locally.

Custom duty

- Reduction of applicable custom duty on import of machineries and raw material by micro, cottage & small industries, animal husbandries, veterinarians and industries producing masks.
- Reduction of applicable custom duty on import of equipment imported by agricultural firms as well as paddy, corn, wheat and vegetable seeds.
- Reduction of applicable custom duty on import of raw material for ayurvedic medicines.
- Increase in applicable custom duty on import of petroleum products (except aviation fuel and LP gas), gold and gold ornaments.

Excise Duty

- Exemption on Excise Duty on internal production of ethanol (to be used as raw material for production of sanitizers) and PPE.
- Excise Duty applicable on items over a dozen removed.
- Excise Duty imposed on import of all furniture goods

Notice by the IRD

Extension of deadline

The IRD has extended the dates for filing the monthly/bimonthly VAT returns, excise return, withholding tax return, education service fees, telephone ownership fees, telecommunication service fees for Falgun, Chaitra 2076 & Baisakh 2077and payment to 21 June 2020 (7 Ashad 2077). Further, the due date of submission and payment of 2nd instalment of advance income tax (70% of the estimated tax for FY 2076-77) has been extended to 29 June 2020 (15 Ashad 2077). Amendment on clean note policy

On 24 May 2020, NRB has issued a notice to all Bank & Financial Institutions to implement amended Clean Note Policy. Amendment is made to address difficulty arising in printing & transportation of notes due to COVID 19 & to promote effective use of policy earlier issued. Direcetive on refinancing procedure

On 1 June 2020, NRB has issued a draft of refinacing procedure, 2077 with the provision of the refinancing small, mico & domestic enterprises, special & general enterprises as specified by the NRB. The central bank has come up with the procedure with the aim of effectively reviving the business enterprises by minimizing impact of the corona virus on the current economy. As per the procedure industry having good operating condition with average annual return of 20% or more in last three years & tobacco/alchol based industry will not be eligible for the loan.
